SPONSOR OVERVIEW

The country's oldest continuously run whitewater kayak and canoe races are taking to the Westfield River once again this April. The Westfield River, running down from the Berkshires through the Hilltowns of Western Mass to the Connecticut River Valley, was given Wild & Scenic designation by an act of US Congress 30 years ago for its ecosystem, history and scenery. This event is important as an annual rite of spring and celebration of the most distinctive feature of the region. The Westfield River Wildwater Races draws spectators and paddlers from throughout the Northeast. Sponsors are connected to this remarkable natural resource and the active, athletic individuals and families drawn to the races and the celebration that follows.

Event Details

- Two race heats:
 - The **Classic Run** which is 8 miles starting in downtown Huntington through to Russell, MA starting at 11AM
 - The Expert Run begins further upriver at Knightville Dam and goes for 5 miles, ending in Huntington starting at 9:30AM.
- River Comes Alive Race Celebration: Noon to 4pm at Strathmore Park in Russell, MA with food trucks, live music, kids activities, awards and more.
- River Creatures Puppet Parade: Environmentalists are working with children at the local elementary schools to teach them about aquatic life and the ecosystem of the river. Kids create puppets of their favorite river creatures and parade at Strathmore Park starting at 2PM.

Westfield River Wildwater Races taking entries for rapid run

"One of the country's oldest whitewater canoe races, down the Westfield River at the height of its flow, will return for its 67th run on Sunday, April 24. More than 250 expert and novice paddlers in both kayaks and canoes will brave class 3 rapids on the Westfield River..."

"Before getting

into canoes, State Rep. Nicholas Boldyga, R-Southwick, and [Westfield Mayor] McCabe admitted it was their first time paddling down the Westfield River. State Rep. Kelly Pease, D-Westfield, said he grew up a few miles up the road from the launch point near the intersection of Routes 20 and 112 so he is very familiar with the waterway. McCabe, a long-distance runner, said he has run along the river many times.
